This one is strange, I cannot recognize any of the elements or shapes as real world elements.

Strange sensations from the materials. Orange and yellow curved shapes, somewhat organic. I would guess this is either a painting or some highly synthetic artifact. I had no impressions to grab a hold of that could have offered me any kind of down to earth lead to follow up on.

Maybe a vague sense of a human or animal with a large orange lip. Maybe roots of trees. The yellow is like a gunk fluid, it is like a thick liquid.

Target PDF, decoy PDF, and matching are done without delay.

Matching: I was happy to see an abstract image among the two, the graph really speaks to me, also because of that raspberry red berry top on the graphs. However, something about the flowing garment, and there being a lip of a human figure, and the black fence is also seen, I have to suspect merging to have taken place. I recognize elements from both images. Although, the fence element I drew is also found on the graph on the left. Hm, what is interesting is that the graph seems to indicate ground deposits of natural gas. My first initial impression from the target signal was the yellow flowing liquid which I wanted to say is like a benzene or a fuel. I choose the graph image as the match to my report, because it is an abstract image which I called out, the fence is there, the fuel benzene liquid that I sensed is relevant to that image, and the red raspberry berry top that I also saw.

Outcome: The target is the image of the statue, so I chose the decoy, I chose the wrong image. Interesting. Because the target landscape I was experiencing was so immensely abstract and artificial, I have to suspect switching or merging on this session. Due to the intensity of the impressions and the abstract of the report I made, I find it less likely for this to have been an ordinary fail session.
